#### **Public Assistance Benefits**

One of the best ways to help someone who is homeless or at risk of homelessness is to help them apply for public assistance benefits. Many people who are homeless are not accessing all the benefits that they are eligible for and this is often because they don't know of the benefits. In Minnesota, the counties and in some cases, tribes administer state and federal public assistance benefits. There are three categories of benefits – cash, food and emergency assistance.

The primary form to apply for any public assistance benefit is the Combined Application Form (CAF). In addition to this form, the person will also have to complete and sign other forms. If you can help someone complete all the paperwork and send all the completed and signed forms into the county or tribe this will greatly help the person access these benefits which can help them pay for their housing. Copies of all of these forms are in your packet and the agency you are working for is also likely to have copies of the forms on file. The agency will also know how to submit the forms to the county or tribe.

Some tips when helping someone complete the forms –

- If the person is homeless, state that on page 1 in the space for address on the Combined Application Form. Being homeless can expediate some benefits.
- Authorized Rep this is on page 7 of the Combined Application. An Authorized Rep will help to
  fill out forms and get notices on behalf of the person. This can be very helpful as it will
  expediate the process to get someone on benefits. Check with your agency to be sure they are
  ok with being named the Authorized Rep. You should *not* check the box for getting and using
  SNAP benefits. The authorized rep will also have to sign at the bottom of page 9.
- Healthcare is an important benefit and nearly everyone you will work with is likely to be eligible for Medical Assistance which is Minnesota's Medicaid program. The process for applying varies based on whether or not the person is receiving a Social Security benefit (SSI or SSDI).

#### **Housing Support (formerly GRH)**

Housing Support is a program for people with disabilities and older adults who have low income. It helps pay for housing and things people need to stay housed in certain group settings or in the community. Housing Support may also <a href="help pay for additional services">help people with stable</a> housing, employment, or health needs they may have if they are not eligible for <a href="personal care">personal care</a> assistance (PCA) services through <a href="Medical Assistance">Medical Assistance</a> (MA) or <a href="MA-Waiver">MA-Waiver</a> programs.

#### **Emergency Assistance**

Please work with your agency staff to determine how the county or tribe administers Emergency Assistance. In addition to the forms below the county or tribe is likely to have their own forms that must also be completed to access Emergency Assistance. Emergency assistance pays for damage deposit, first month's rent, past due utility bills. A household is usually eligible once a year.

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#### Healthcare

Healthcare is a critical benefit for clients and must be renewed annually. Nearly everyone you work with is likely to be eligible for Medical Assistance (Minnesota's version of Medicaid). Since most of the people you serve are or have been homeless, they probably have not received their Medical Assistance renewal packet in the mail.

#### **Social Security**

Department of Human Services' (DHS) Social Security Advocacy services help individuals (both children and adults), increase access to Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits for those who are homeless or experiencing at risk of becoming homeless. To qualify for either Social Security program an individual must have a physical or mental health impairment that will last more than a year and have significant functional impairments that affect their ability to do any work activity.
